Some of the ladies were Rose Wick, Margaret Legg, Emma Shaffer, Mrs. Whited, Mrs. Hein, and Mrs. Fowler. They made quilts and sold them.

Peg remembered a few more Pioneers of the sewing circle too. Mrs.

Minerva Wright, Mrs. Parthinia Nelson an Mrs. Shown. Some of the Pastors Reba remembered were Gibbered, Denver Fields, John Hillen, John Henderson, Brady Duncan, Micky Wick and presently Jeff Arther. Jeff was raised in the church. Reba was the oldest member in attendance. She would invite you to come and worship with them and see how the Lord had blessed his church.

"They surely were blessed. Look at the attendance then! Look how many kids!

Peg recalls that her Grandfather John Legg rang the bell. He would say her was calling the Saints out to Gods House. He rang the bell until he died. That was also the time when the bell tolled when anyone died. They rang it once for every year.

Margaret Legg's bible was placed in th right hand corner of the foundation of the church when they built it. Peg and most of her family attended the church in her early years.

Reba said that in 1951 (The year Reba was Baptized) Mickey Wick was pastor and Peck Arthur was Sunday School Supt. On any church night you could see Peck on his way to church with daughters Linda and Mary Lou. They have been attending church ever since and the family attends too.

#### Bancroft Volunteer Fire Department

PLEASE REMEMBER <u>1 MARCH STARTED FIRE SEASON</u>. No open burning from 7am to 5pm until May 31.

#### Gill Fire Safety:

1. Keep your grill at least 10 feet away from your house. Farther is even better. This applies to both charcoal and gas grills.

2. Clean your grill regularly. If you allow grease and fat to build up on your grill, they provide more fuel for a fire. Grease is a major source of flare ups.

3. Check for gas leaks. Make sure no gas is leaking from your gas grill.

4. Keep decorations away from your grill. Decorations like hanging baskets, pillows and umbrellas look pretty AND provide fuel for a fire.

5. Keep a spray bottle of water handy. That way, if you have a minor flare-up you

can spray it with the water to instantly calm it.

6. Keep a fire extinguisher within a couple steps of your grill. And KNOW HOW TO USE IT.

7. Do not turn on the gas while your grill lid is closed. It causes gas to build up inside your grill, and when you do light it and open it, a fireball can explode in your face.

8. Don't leave a grill unattended. Fires double in size every minute.

9. Don't overload your grill with food. This applies especially fatty meats.


10. Do not use a grill indoors. People often think it will be safe to use a grill, especially a small one, indoors. NOT TRUE.


