A neighbor contacted the Mayor about a male and female vagrants staying in the Bancroft ballfield dug out. They had sleeping bags. She contacted 911 and ran them off. She and the Mayor cleaned up the dugout where they had urinated in and had used drugs. They found 2 baggies with residue and q-tips (they use those to filter the impuritys out of heroin. Also the neighbor on 2nd avenues Motorhome was burned and was completely gutted. Fire Marshall said it was Suspected Arson. Also neighbor on 1st. Avenues Building was broke into and a neighbor on Washington St. Apartment had her gas stolen out of her car.

If you see anything suspicious or have had anything stolen ,please notify the Sheriffs office. Also let us know what is going on . Your name can remain anonymous. I was told by the Mayor that **License Plate numbers** will be taken from people at the Park or in town, that are suspicious and given to law enforcement.

It was nothing to get hit on the head by a cud of tobacco, a piece of candy or popcorn during the movie. When the Movie started to come on ,the Big Lion would roar on the screen and always would scare the girls everytime.

Some of the features were Tarzan, The Three Musketeers, Lash LeRue, Hopalong Cassidy etc,

One day someone threw a coal shovel through the movie screen. It left a perfect print of the shovel. As the story went, when they had a Western, the horses would ride smack dab through the hole.

Sometimes they had to stop the show to settle a dispute, which of course was settled by slugging it out. After they settled things, they would continue the movie

(two shows for the price of one)

For 25 cents you could get your ticket, a bottle of soda pop and a big bag of popcorn. By the time the show was over you had to slide your feet to get out because of the tobacco juice etc. everywhere. That's how everyone learned to skate in Bancroft (Just joking about skates) Also the Theater later burned down. "Living in the exciting world of old Bancroft"
