A True World War Two story: Told by Jacky Burgess of Bancroft.

The time was Dec. 7th. 1941 when the young men of my church were gathering at R.L. Gibsons home, preparing to go to Frank Millers for the Sunday afternoon prayer, when someone came running in and said. "President Roosevelt has declared war on Japan and the Japanese have bombed Pearl Harbor!"

One by one the young men were called to duty. First the single men, then the married ones, then men with children, so of course most of the men were gone and the women had to carry the load of the Church. Women led the services. We prayed a lot. We had a three tiered stand that would hold a lot of candles. We had candle lighting and prayer service on Thursdays. This caught on and soon we were gettig the names of service men from everywhere. Then we put the pictures of our service men on the wall. Pictures started coming from everywhere. We wrote letters to all the men and a lot wrote back.

Here are some of the mens names. Lonard Gibson, Harry King, Ray Ball, Dennis Arthur, Frank Allen Sr., James Legg Sr. and I might have missed some.

The wonderful part of this story is that, though some were wounded in the War, they all came home alive. Not one was lost.

With daylight savings time ending Nov 3 below are some safety tips for smoke detectors.

- 1. Install smoke detectors in every bedroom. Also, in the hallway outside living areas. Install alarms in the basement.
- 2. Large homes may require more detectors.
- 3. If possible, use interconnected smoke alarms, so if one goes off, they all do.
- 4. Test detectors at least monthly by pressing the button to ensure they are working.
- 5. Current alarms on the market employ different types of technology including multi-sensing, which include smoke and carbon monoxide combined.
- 6. Smoke detector locations should be on the ceiling or high on the wall. Also keep them from the kitchen to reduce false alarms.

People that are hard of hearing or deaf can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers

- 7. Please replace smoke detectors every 10 years.
- 8. A closed door my slow the spread of smoke, fire, and heat.
